OBJECTIVES

- Carry out transnational research with a focus on the impacts of youth migration in cities
- Help clarify facts on migration-related demographic, labour-market and social trends which affect people's lives
- Create new ways of measuring these trends which can help planning and strategy
- Help municipalities cope with day-to-day new situations they meet through migration
- Link research findings to local development goals to help improve policy



PARTNERSHIP

Research institutes, universities, statistical offices and local government bodies from eight countries (Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Germany, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia) join forces in this network of project partners.

ACTIVITIES

- Using scientific research to understand youth migration
- Gathering input from young migrants and social providers on the burning issues
- Scientists, local authorities and decision-makers work together to identify data needs, gaps in services
- Making population projections about the future
- Organising visits between cities with similar migration profiles
- Building a knowledge reference base
- Designing and testing pilot practices
